ANNOUNCING OBT'S 2015|16 SEASON

OREGON BALLET THEATRE MOVES INTO THE FUTURE BY EMBRACING THE PAST

Oregon Ballet Theatre is proud to announce its 2015|16 season. "If there is one unifying theme this year," observes Artistic Director Kevin Irving, "it is that the future includes and embraces the past." Now in its 26th year the company continues to break new ground by adding three premieres to its repertory from choreographers that span generations including: August Bournonville's vibrant Act III from *Napoli*, Nicolo Fonte's haunting full-evening work *Beautiful Decay*, and a not yet titled world premiere from audience favorite James Kudelka. These ground breaking works are primed by the return to the OBT stage of a ballet from the company's storied past – OBT is thrilled to present James Canfield's *Romeo & Juliet*. Finally, no ballet season would be complete without the rich tradition of George Balanchine's *The Nutcracker* which is reinvigorated every time it is performed with the enthusiasm of the young dancers from the School of Oregon Ballet Theatre.

OBT's 26th season begins with its fall program, *Amore Italiano* – a high-spirited double-bill that revels in a love affair with the culture and especially the music of Italy. James Kudelka (creator of the acclaimed *Almost Mozart*) returns to Portland to choreograph a new work based on the beautiful music of Boccherini. Next, OBT presents for the first time ever Act III of *Napoli* – a signature work by the 19th century Danish choreographer, August Bournonville. Known for its exceptional male solos and lively Tarantella, Bournonville's *Napoli* is a joyful, sunny spectacle! The work features the entire company, plus members of the School of Oregon Ballet Theatre, and to add a bit of Portland flare – violinist Aaron Meyer and his ensemble will celebrate Italy in their own unique fashion.

The winter program will set hearts on fire with the passion of a love that recognizes no boundaries, and is intensified by Prokofiev's sublime score. Oregon Ballet Theatre proudly returns James Canfield's signature work *Romeo & Juliet* to the repertory for the first time in 15 years. Originally created for Pacific Ballet Theatre (OBT's precursor) in 1989, Canfield's inspired and rousing telling of this most-romantic-of-tales was a mainstay in the OBT repertory for many years.

Oregon Ballet Theatre closes its season with Nicolo Fonte's *Beautiful Decay*, a full-evening work in two parts that is exciting and haunting in equal measure. Nicolo Fonte follows last season's breathtaking collaboration with Pink Martini (*Never Stop Falling (In Love)*) with a production that juxtaposes the daring athleticism and technical prowess for which he is so well known, against the stark reality that with age comes a more fragile state – a state that nonetheless still resonates with the power and beauty of distant youth. Guest artists (and Portland contemporary dance icons) Susan Banyas and Gregg Bielemeier join the artists of Oregon Ballet Theatre, embodying Fonte's theme that we carry all of our ages inside ourselves at all times.
